This section is intended for questions and answers (as well as opinions) about what has worked best in your house for things from nose wrinkles to tear stains to tail pockets. Keep in mind this is not veterinary advice and what works for one bulldog may not work for the next.

This month's question:

What kind of teeth and gum problems have you had in older bulldogs?

We recently had a rescue dog whose teeth were in terrible shape. Her owner said she didn't like to chew, but since she now chews on Nylabones in her new home, so I think they were never really provided. Red (now called Gracie) is a good example of how bad a dog's teeth can get if you don't take care of them. Gracie/Red had ten teeth pulled and a thorough dental cleaning. Amazing how nice her teeth were afterward. Her breath before the cleaning was so bad you could smell her from 5 feet away. It was awful. Red/Gracie also had hair impacted between her teeth...probably from licking food up from a dirty floor. Red/Gracie is a good example of why you want to keep your dog's teeth clean as they get older. Bad breath is a dead give-away that your dog's teeth need cleaning. If they don't chew enough to keep their teeth clean, then they should be brushed. But always use toothpaste made for dog's, not people.

We haven't had dog teeth problems, knock on wood. We feed raw and give meaty raw bones which I think helps.

Next month's question:

7 mo old Bulldog knawing sheetrock so it indents wall, eats off wooden outlet cover and now broke off 4 slats in our door. How to control? He will be shown in ring so neuter isn't an option.

7 mo old Bulldog possessive towards our Cavalier regarding his toys, bones and treats. He will take over toys our other dog has and will hold a stiff stance and bark once at our Cavalier if he thinks she's too close to bone. He's okay with humans messing with his toys and dog food while he's at it. What to do that won't get in way of training him to show in ring.

7 mo Bulldog seems to not know his own strength when playing with our Cavalier. He makes her yelp and she squeals when he bites her tail and ear. Is this normal? Is there anything I should do?

One of our Wrinkle Time readers wrote: One of our bulldogs had a knack for quickly backing out of pretty much any collar or harness we tried on him, no matter how well fit, if we were asking him to do something he didn't want to do. In 2 seconds I would find myself holding an empty leash while Gus headed back home. In searching for a solution, I found a crafter on Etsy that custom makes Martingale collars, which are primarily used for greyhounds and related breeds. A Martingale is a collar with a bit of self-adjustment built in, either with a small loop of chain or nylon webbing. I thought this might be a good option for my Houdini dog problems, so I asked her to make a couple to my dimensions. I was very pleasantly surprised that they not only prevented Gus from slipping his collar, but they solved our pulling problems as well. He can't back out of it because the tension on the leash snugs up the collar just a bit, keeping it from slipping over his big head and the reinforces good walking behavior at the same time.
