BULLDOG RESCUE

Springtime means green grass, blooming flowers and warm weather. It also means annual veterinary checkups for our dogs. I think we would all agree that Bulldogs are more likely than some breeds to need veterinary care and often times they need expensive veterinary surgery. Some families can't afford the thousands of dollars to repair a torn ACL, so they contact a rescue can help their dog rather than have to have it put to sleep because they can't afford to fix it. And we do our best to make sure that these dogs receive the care that they need so that they can live long, healthy lives in their new forever homes.

Our rescue has had dogs that needed ACL repairs, palate clips, ear ablation surgery and tail amputations. These are all surgeries that cost thousands of dollars. Coming up with needed funds is always a challenge for Bulldog Rescue groups as our veterinary costs tend to be much higher than many other dog rescues. Without the generous support of our excellent vets at In-



ver Grove Heights Animal Hospital we would have had to close down our rescue long ago due to lack of funds. The reality is that many dogs require a lot of veterinary care far beyond what we can ask in adoption donations, so please consider participating in our upcoming rescue fundraisers.

Coco-Bella came to our rescue a few years back. Due to a change due to health concerns, her adoptive family had to return her to our rescue for rehoming.

Ralphie is another good recent rescue addition. He was an intact male that started marking on laundry. He hadn't been to a vet in years and no doubt neutering him years ago might have meant he'd still be in his home today. He has been neutered, and brought up to date on vaccinations and was checked for heartworm disease once he came into rescue. Like Sampson, is in a "foster to adopt home". We cannot continue our rescue work without the necessary funds to take care of these dogs, so please donate or purchase from our garage sales. And most of all, please come to the Wrinkle Time picnic.
